HITCHCOCK SILENT FILM TO BE SHOWN

The Arts Center at Killingworth will begin a monthly film screening club Friday with a presentation of the Alfred



Hitchcock silent classic "The Lodger."

The film stars Ivor Novello as the

unnamed title character, who seems to be Jack the Ripper. The film was based on the novel by Marie Belloc Lowndes, the first book to suggest a solution to the notorious 19th-century serial killings.

It was the fifth film for the master of suspense — who would not conquer Hollywood for 13 more years — and the one in which he began his recurring pattern of casting himself in a cameo. He appears briefly as a man in a newspaper office.

The 1927 film is 75 minutes long and unrated. Rob Glidden, a film writer for newspapers on the shoreline, will introduce the film and do a Q&A afterward.

The screening, at 7 p.m., will be held at the Arts Center, 276 N. Parker Hill Road.

Admission is \$14 per film, or \$45 for the entire fall series, which will last until December.
